

# A Step by Step Guide to Setting Up Educa

## Before you start

Access Educa online (best using Chrome) or via our free Educa Touch Android or iOS (Apple) app.

- "Admins" have full rights. The person who starts the trial can give other users admin rights.
- Educa has a "<u>class privacy</u>" option. Use it to manage which children teachers can see.
- · Your educators need individual email addresses a work/personal email

#### 1. Log in to Educa

Click "Activate" in the email from Educa support to <u>activate your account</u>.

Invite teachers
Invite a teacher or two to help you explore Educa.

#### 3. Attend an online workshop

We have webinars by feature and introductory sessions. **Register here**.

#### 4. Add children

Add children one-by-one or send a list to Educa support. This article shows you how that works, including downloads from billing and database vendors.

#### 5. Choose curriculum goal sets and or values to link to

Check boxes in the curriculum library (under Tools) for linking to stories and plans. Most national frameworks are preloaded. Or create your own. <u>More here.</u>

#### 6. Practice creating stories

Experiment with the <u>story editor</u> and publish some test stories with your team.

#### 7. Add About, Policies & Resources

Share your story, policies and resources with teachers and.or parents under the "Centre" tab.

#### 8. Get ready to invite parents

Try adding a **group story** to the children's portfolios so that when parents log in for the first time there is something personal for them to see.

Use Educa to create a community of carign adults around every child. Here's how to get connected to parents and extended family.

#### 1. Invite parents

Invite all parents or just a few until your teachers are comfortable. Here's a **pitch/invite** to send parents.

#### 2. Requesting permission

Your service agreement probably covers privacy issues, e.g., sharing playground photos with all parents. However, if you feel you need to ask permission for sharing photos, etc., here is a **parent consent form**.

#### 3. Create stories

A story uses text, images, videos and documents. It's how you record and communicate a child's learning and development in Educa - with family, other teachers, inspectors and others.

It is useful to <u>link to curriculum</u> or plans to provide learning context for parents and for compliance. Encourage families to contribute stories and family moments to a child's portfolio too.

#### 4. Ways to communicate with parents

Communicate privately with parents by posting a story, commenting on an existing story or with a "<u>Shared Note</u>". Parent replies are private.

Communicate with parents as a group through Messages. Replies are seen by all, after approval.

#### 5. Create plans and more

<u>Planning</u> (under Tools) is for individual, group and lesson plans. <u>Forms</u> (also under Tools) is where you can work on reviews, checklists, projects.

#### 6. Work with your team

- Have private educator conversations.
- Use <u>story approval</u> to manage and mentor younger teachers.
- Collborate in plans and forms.

#### **Announcing Educa to families**

#### **Reports**

- The parent engagement <u>reports</u> give you an idea of how well you are connecting with parents. You can drill down and see who is active, and who is not.
- Child progress reports give you a graphical picture of how a child is progressing versus curriculum goals.
- Reports can be downloaded.

#### Forms - for everything

For children, e.g., assessments, and parents, e.g., permission slips, for teachers, e.g., appraisals, development plans, and for your service, e.g., reviews, hazard lists.

#### Widen a child's caring and support network

Educa is child-centred. In addition to parents and extended family, consider inviting other interested parties, e.g., speech & language therapists.

#### **Teacher portfolios**

A private <u>portfolio</u> for each teacher to log professional development -- an online resume, refelective practice and evidence of achievement.
